Streaming and Video Equipment FAQ

This document is intended to provide a general idea of the equipment and possibilities that are available to our supported arts groups. The equipment that is available for streaming and video purposes includes:

- Three 4K digital cameras, with stands and dollies
- Two Mevo Start livestreaming cameras
- One livestreaming video switcher
- Two short throw HD projectors
- Macbook Pro for video
- Macbook Pro for audio
- Two condenser mics for vocal recording
- A 4 channel USB audio interface

Q. What can this equipment be used for?

A. The equipment can be used for many types of projects, for example:

- Livestreaming events
- Capturing video for post-production purposes
- Creating podcasts
- Projection mapping
- Showing movies

Q. What are some examples of camera set-ups that can be achieved with this equipment?

A. We can achieve a one to three camera setup for video recording and livestreaming using OBS, which will stream to your platform of choice. In the case of a simple single camera setup, the Mevo Start camera has the capability to stream and record using the corresponding mobile app.

Q. Who can request to use the equipment?

A. All supported arts groups can request to use the equipment for an event in an Arlington Arts venue. All requests must be submitted online through the [Technical Services Request Form](#).

Q. Who can operate the equipment?

A. All cameras, computers, and audio equipment must be operated by the CAD technicians that are assigned to your event, with the sole exception of the HD laser projectors. No equipment will be lent out or taken outside of the Arlington Arts venues unless authorized by the CAD Head Theater Technician or the CAD Operations Manager. Limitations may apply depending on demand and staff availability.

Q. Is there a cost to request the equipment?

A. Currently the equipment is included under the standard space agreement and there is no additional cost.
